System Brings Snow to Wintry Mix February 12th

Snow developed over the area between 1 - 3 PM on February 12th with temperatures in the upper-20's. Snow turned moderate to heavy shortly after it began and gradually lightened as it changed over to sleet (mixed with some snow) towards 6 – 8 PM. The sleet mixture continued, mixing briefly with freezing rain before changing to plain rain as temperatures warmed above freezing towards 10 PM. The remainder of the event featured mostly rain. The period of sleet led to approximately 0.5" of sleet (included in the total). With sleet being generally three to four times denser than snow, this led to an extremely heavy and dense snow/sleet pack relative to the overall accumulation.

System Brings Snow to Brief Wintry Mix February 12th

Snow developed over the area between 1 - 3 PM on February 12th with temperatures in the upper-20's to 30 degrees. Snow turned moderate to heavy shortly after it began and gradually lightened as it mixed with a period of sleet (mixed with some snow) between 5 – 8 PM. Precipitation then changed to plain rain following the sleet with temperatures 33 – 36 degrees. The period of sleet led up to approximately 0.5" of sleet (included in the total). With sleet being generally three to four times denser than snow, this led to an extremely heavy and dense snow/sleet pack relative to the overall accumulation.

Snow developed over the area between 12 - 2 PM on February 12th with temperatures in the upper-20's. Snow turned moderate to heavy shortly after it began and gradually lightened as it changed over to sleet (mixed with some snow) towards 5 – 7 PM. The sleet mixture continued, mixing briefly with spotty freezing rain before changing to plain rain as temperatures warmed above freezing towards 8 - 9 PM. The remainder of the event featured mostly rain. The period of sleet led to approximately 0.5" of sleet (included in the total). With sleet being generally three to four times denser than snow, this led to an extremely heavy and dense snow/sleet pack relative to the overall accumulation.
